Why SCHOLAR?

So what makes SCHOLAR different? The online learning materials, authored for the SQA syllabus, consist of text and graphics, interactivities, simulations and online tests and can be accessed online at home or at school. Pupils can monitor their own progress and teachers set pupils' work, and track how they are doing – allowing SCHOLAR to support the whole learning process.

An online tutoring service and live homework sessions are now also available.

Mobile devices

What strikes people most when they see SCHOLAR for the first time are the interactivities and simulations which make subjects come alive. Maths graphs draw themselves on a PC or Tablet screen. Activities in Physics confirm the results of students' calculations and listening exercises improve language skills.
